PURPOSE OF SPECIFIC PLAN


- Provide a vision for the future of downtown over the next 20 years

PROJECT TIMELINE


TIMELINE OF SAN DIMAS DOWNTOWN SPECIFIC PLAN COMPLETION:

As of May 5, 2022, site has generated 117 ideas and 81 comments











Question 2 What of the following do you like about downtown San Dimas? Select all that apply.





MINDMIXER – INTERACTIVE MAP






 - More dining, bars, and shops
 - Additional uses including hip eateries with alcohol service, gift shop, ice cream salon, dinner show theater
 - Reduce salons/barbers and antique stores
 - Adding dining, shopping, and entertainment venues
 - Connecting plazas, bike lanes

BREAKOUT ROOM ACTIVITY SUMMARY

- Existing Positive Attributes of Downtown San Dimas
 - Downtown San Dimas has a home-town charm, historic feel, and is the life of the community (x7)
 - Downtown is very **walkable** (x5)
 - Community events: concerts in the park, farmers market (x2)





BREAKOUT ROOM ACTIVITY SUMMARY

Opportunities for Improvement

- Have more people stay and shop locally, and provide diversity of stores, activities, entertainment, restaurants (x14)
- More community programs like rodeo, parades, 5k in downtown, local high school performances, farmers market (x3)
- Create identity through signage, landmarks, and placemaking (x2)





BREAKOUT ROOM ACTIVITY SUMMARY

- **Challenges Facing Downtown San Dimas**
 - **Provision of adequate parking (x6)**
 - No places for social gathering or places to linger (x4)
 - **Lack of economic development** (x3)
 - → Housing affordability average home price vs. income (x3)





DRAFT VISION STATEMENT & GOALS

- A draft Vision Statement was crafted to capture the key values and aspirations expressed by the community for the future of the Downtown San Dimas Specific Plan area.
- The Vision Statement paints a picture of what the Downtown area could look like and how it could function in the next 10-15 years.
- Following the Vision Statement are draft goals which will help implement the vision and provide direction for the overall Specific Plan area.



DRAFT SAN DIMAS DTSP VISION STATEMENT

Downtown is the heart of the City of San Dimas- a walkable and vibrant activity center which celebrates and preserves its historic, charming character and provides a diversity of retail, restaurant, cultural, and civic uses, a variety of housing types, and local employment opportunities which breathe life and activity into the town core.



- 1. Human-Scale Environment with Historic Character
 - Preserve Downtown's charm and its historic resources.
 - Ensure new development is compatible in scale, massing, and architectural design.
 - Enhance sense of place and City's identity.





- 2. A Diverse Economy with a Broad Mix of Land Uses and Activities
 - Compatible, compact development around Gold Line station.
 - Promote mix of uses and services to serve needs of entire community (i.e. youth, families, seniors).
 - Support local businesses to generate activities and stimulate local economy.



- 3. Vibrant and Active Public and Private Spaces
 - Encourage development and events that activate public streets (i.e. farmers markets, outdoor dining, pedestrianfriendly sidewalks, etc.).
 - Create a safe and enhanced public realm with outdoor furniture, seating, fountains, etc.
 - Enhance pedestrian linkages between Gold Line station and Bonita Avenue.



- 4. A Safe and Comfortable Pedestrian and Cycling Environment
 - Ensure downtown streets are pedestrian-oriented.
 - Design complete streets that emphasize safety and accommodate all modes of travel, including pedestrians and cyclists.
 - Provide lighting and traffic calming measures for safety.
 - Provide landscaping to enhance pedestrian experience.



5. A Range of Housing Types

- Allow for a range of housing types to meet the needs of current and future residents.
- Allow and encourage the development of affordable housing choices within walking distance of the Gold (L) Line Station.





- 6. Parking That Is Supportive of New Uses and Activities in Downtown
 - Increase parking opportunities around the downtown core.
 - Develop and incorporate parking management strategies around the Gold Line station that encourage efficient use of parking resources.



- 7. "First/Last Mile" Connections to Transit
 - Provide safe and accessible "first/last mile" multimodal connectivity between the future station and downtown destinations.
 - Encourage and facilitate shared-ride options include e-hailing services, carshare, bikeshare, and microtransit.





- 8. Sustainable Development and Infrastructure
 - Support growth that is sustainable for the City's public infrastructure and overall built environment.
 - The Downtown Specific Plan area grows in tandem with the City's public infrastructure and be conscientious of its environmental impact and environmental sustainability.
