




SPECIFIC PLAN OVERVIEW

- Provides a vision for Downtown over the next 20 years
- Guide and incentivize new investment, development, and improvements
- Establish new zoning regulations (permitted uses, heights, setbacks, site design, etc.)
- Changes to land use, circulation, and other aspects of the built environment where desired







CEQA Process

- The California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) requires the City to evaluate potential adverse impacts before making decisions that could affect the environment.
- Once the City determines that a project is subject to CEQA, an initial study is prepared to determine if an EIR is necessary and what topics to evaluate in that EIR.
- The City then issues a Notice of Preparation (NOP) that is filed with the State and the County, mailed to other public agencies and also made available to the public for a review period of 30 days.



CEQA Process



Contents of Initial Study

- Summary Project Description
 - Enough detail for level of analysis and comment
- Review of Potential Impacts
 Based on State Checklist containing 20 topics
- Determination of Issues for Further Analysis in EIR
 Conclusions of potential for a significant impact



Contents of EIR

- Project Description
 - Greater detail than Initial Study
- Description of Existing Conditions
 Baseline from which change is evaluated
- Analysis of Potential Environmental Impacts
 For those topics identified in Initial Study
- Identification of Mitigation Measures
 For those topics determined to have significant effect
- Consideration of Project Alternatives
 As ways to avoid impacts



Topics Not Anticipated To Be Evaluated In EIR

- Identified in Initial Study as not needing further study:
 - Aesthetics
 - Agriculture & Forestry
 - Airport Hazards & Noise
 - Biological Resources
 - Geology Seismology & Soils
 - Hydrology & Water Quality
 - Housing Displacement
 - Mineral Resources
 - Wildfire



Potential Construction Impacts

- The Specific Plan is expected to lead to new construction within downtown San Dimas
- Based on the Initial Study, construction activity will be evaluated in the EIR for effects on:
 - ✤ Air Quality
 - Cultural Resources
 - Geology Paleontological
 - Hazards & Hazardous Materials
 - Noise
 - Tribal Cultural Resources



Potential Operational Impacts

- The Specific Plan is expected to increase the population and activity in downtown San Dimas over time.
- Based on the Initial Study, the development potential of the Plan will be evaluated in the EIR for effects on:
 - Air Quality
 - Energy
 - Greenhouse Gas Emissions
 - Land Use Policy
 - Population Growth
 - Public Services
 - Recreation
 - Transportation
 - Utilities (Water/Wastewater)
